Children & hydration

Our bodies are made up of approximately 70% water. Water has many important functions in the body, including; regulating your body's temperature and digesting food. Children don't always recognise that they're thirsty and if they're not encouraged or reminded may forget to drink. Some of the common symptoms for dehydration include...

- Headaches
- Poor concentration
- Thirst
- Cracked lips
- Dry mouth
- Constipation
- Lethargy
- Dark urine

For children under 8 years of age, at least 4 - 6 glasses of water is recommended. For children older than 8 years of age a minimum of 6-8 glasses is recommended.


