Last Friday 3rd September was National Jersey Day. Jersey Day was inspired by the gift of life that Nathan Gremmo gave to six people when he became an organ donor at 13, and it continues to grow each year. JERSEY DAY is the perfect opportunity to start a discussion with your loved ones about organ donation. One organ and tissue donor can transform the lives of many people. Australia is a world leader for successful transplants. Australia's donation rate has more than doubled in recent years, but there is much more we can do. In Australia and internationally the need for transplantation exceeds the availability of organs. Around 1,600 Australians are currently waitlisted for a transplant. On average, people on the transplant list must wait between 6 months and 4 years. A further 12,000 are on dialysis, many of whom would benefit from a kidney transplant.

On National Jersey Day schools and workplaces are asked to wear their jerseys to show support of organ donation and have a fun day. Even though we are currently in lockdown staff from G.S Kidd supported the day and sent in their photos wearing their favourite team jersey.



QR Codes for Schools

The Service NSW COVID safe check-in is required for visitors to the school, complimenting existing school visitor sign-in processes, including the external visitors to the school site form.
